jane duran s worlds of knowing begins to fill an enormous gap in the literature of feminist epistemology a wide ranging cross cultural primer on worldviews and epistemologies of various cultures and their appropriations by indigenous feminist movements in those cultures it is the much needed epistemological counterpart to work on cross cultural feminist social and political philosophy this project is absolutely breath taking in scope yet a manageable read for anyone with some background in feminist theory history or anthropology duran draws many comparisons and connections to western philosophical and feminist ideas yet avoids facile or imperialistic over universalization her book is powerful comprehensive and brave it will prove an enormously useful resource for scholars in women s studies philosophy anthropology religious studies and history

uruguayan writer eduardo galeano has described u s and latin american culture as continually hobbled by amnesia unable or unwilling to remember the influence of mestizos and indigenous populations in mestizos come home author robert con davis undiano documents the great awakening of mexican american and latino culture since the 1960s that has challenged this omission in collective memory he maps a new awareness of the united states as intrinsically connected to the broader context of the americas at once native and new to the american southwest mexican americans have come home in a profound sense they have reasserted their right to claim that land and u s culture as their own mestizos come home explores key areas of change that mexican americans have brought to the united states these areas include the recognition of mestizo identity especially its historical development across the nineteenth and twentieth centuries the re emergence of indigenous relationships to land and the promotion of mesoamerican conceptions of the human body clarifying and bridging critical gaps in cultural history davis undiano considers important artifacts from the past and present connecting the casta caste paintings of eighteenth century mexico to modern day artists including john valadez alma lópez and luis a jiménez jr he also examines such community celebrations as day of the dead cinco de mayo and lowrider car culture as examples of mestizo influence on mainstream american culture woven throughout is the search for meaning and understanding of mestizo identity a large scale landmark account of mexican american culture mestizos come home shows that mestizos are essential to u s national culture as an argument for social justice and a renewal of america s democratic ideals this book marks a historic cultural homecoming

an american language is a tour de force that revolutionizes our understanding of u s history it reveals the origins of spanish as a language binding residents of the southwest to the politics and culture of an expanding nation in the 1840s as the west increasingly integrated into the united states over the following century

struggles over power identity and citizenship transformed the place of the spanish language in the nation an american language is a history that reimagines what it means to be an american with profound implications for our own time

an erudite comprehensive analysis of latinx identity in the united states as it relates to american culture society and politics eduardo bonilla silva author of racism without racists latinx pronounced la teen ex is the gender neutral term that covers one of the largest and fastest growing minorities in the united states accounting for 17 percent of the country over 58 million americans belong to the category including a sizable part of the country s working class both foreign and native born their political empowerment is altering the balance of forces in a growing number of states and yet latinx barely figure in america s ongoing conversation about race and ethnicity remarkably the us census does not even have a racial category for latino in this groundbreaking discussion ed morales explains how latinx political identities are tied to a long latin american history of mestizaje mixedness or hybridity and that this border thinking is both a key to understanding bilingual

the u s mexico border region is home to anthropologist carlos vřlez ib ez into these pages he pours nearly half a century of searching and finding answers to the mexican experience in the southwestern united states he describes and analyzes the process as generation upon generation of mexicans moved north and attempted to create an identity or sense of cultural space and place in today's border fences he also sees barriers to how mexicans understand themselves and how they are fundamentally understood from prehistory to the present vřlez ib ez traces the intense bumping among native americans spaniards and mexicans as mesoamerican populations and ideas moved northward he demonstrates how cultural glue is constantly replenished by strengthening family ties that reach across both sides of the border the author describes ways in which mexicans have resisted and accommodated the dominant culture by creating communities and by forming labor unions voluntary associations and cultural movements he analyzes the distribution of sadness or overrepresentation of mexicans in poverty crime illness and war and shows how that sadness is balanced by creative expressions of literature and art especially mural art in the ongoing search for space and place here is a book for the nineties and beyond a book that relates to nafta to complex questions of immigration and to the expanding population of mexicans in the u s mexico border region and other parts of the country an important new volume for social science humanities and latin american scholars border visions will also attract general readers for its robust narrative and autobiographical edge for all readers the book points to new ways of seeing borders whether they are visible walls of brick and stone or less visible infinitely more powerful barriers of the mind

the nuyorican poets café has for the past forty years provided a space for multicultural artistic expression and a platform for the articulation of puerto rican and black cultural politics the café s performances poetry music hip hop comedy and drama have been studied in detail but until now little attention has been paid to the voices of its women artists through archival research and interview nuyorican feminist performance examines the contributions of 1970s and 80s performer as and how they challenged the café s gender politics it also looks at recent artists who have built on that foundation with hip hop performances that speak to contemporary audiences the book spotlights the work of foundational artists such as sandra maría esteves martita morales luz rodríguez and amina muñoz before turning to contemporary artists la bruja mariposa aya de león and nilaja sun who infuse their poetry and solo pieces with both nuyorican and hip hop aesthetics

as food studies has grown into a well established field literary scholars have not fully addressed the prevalent themes of food eating and consumption in chicana o literature here contributors propose food consciousness as a paradigm to examine the literary discourses of chicana o authors as they shift from the nation to the postnation

these new westers johnson reveals line dance and two step listen to garth brooks and george strait drink beer from long neck bottles wear clothes ordered from sheplers watch rodeo on espn play wild west arcade games eat fajitas and tacos in stuccoed mexican cafes collect western art and native american crafts and vacation in and move to the west new westers rewrite the history and biography of the west they reimagine the west in cowboy sagas and poetry native american novels

mexican american drama nature writing revisionist films eclectic visual artwork and neo traditional music they flock to movies like *thelma and louise* unforgiven and dances with wolves watch mini series like *lonesome dove* and read bestsellers like *the crossing* and *all the pretty horses* new westers are men and women who may or may not have ever hitched up a horse but who crave connection with the west at the end of a century of urbanization technological change and cultural confusion they seek a more natural home a fuller and wider sense of place and a deeper and more colorful personal identity they also want to revive the dream of the mythic west but on different terms they overrun the old west and yet strive to preserve it raising troubling new concerns about the differences between the mythic and the real between traditional and contemporary cultural influences

the elusive quest for equality documents both the plight and the struggle of chicano communities over the past 150 years using the guiding themes of segregation americanization and resistance in the history of education for chicanos chicanas the history of the chicano community's quest for educational equality is long and rich since the treaty of guadalupe hidalgo formalized the conquest of half of mexico's territory into what is now the u s southwest chicanos have fought to claim what was promised them in the treaty the enjoyment of all the rights of u s citizens in terms of education they certainly have never had equal access opportunity or resources despite legal victories in this volume some of the leading scholars analyze why the quest for equality in education has remained so elusive they do so by documenting both the plight and the struggle of chicano communities over the past 150 years using the guiding themes of the role of language segregation americanization and resistance in the history of education for chicanos chicanas in the cover painting of this book manuel hernandez trujillo captures the dualistic nature of the u s conquest of northern mexico reflecting both the losses and opportunities represented in his camino de espinas road of thorns this tension between cynicism and optimism pervades the essays in this volume something i see over and over again in discussions that focus on the significance of race in a democratic society to what extent does the past determine our future and to what degree do our own expectations of the future influence our interpretations of the past it seems to me that these two interdependent questions continue to shape both our experience as chicanos chicanas and our understanding of what it means to be chicano chicana in the united states at the end of the twentieth century manuel n gómez vice chancellor student services university of california irvine from the foreword

all too often groups who do not effectively define themselves find that others assume the power to explain them until recently this has certainly been the case with american latinos as evidenced by demeaning media stereotypes and the groups s near invisibility in u s history texts indeed as the demise of the soviet empire shifted america s national anxieties to domestic irritants images of latinos as changed for the worse immigration reform acts in 1965 and 1986 brought millions of new immigrants from latin american countries by the end of the 1980s their presence had become vexing to many english only movements sprang up bilingual education came under attack movements to close the border gained momentum now latinos as are speaking back the latino condition brings together some of these new voices and some of the pioneers in law sociology history politics and literature this pathbreaking volume addresses such questions as who exactly is a latino a who is hispanic who is chicano a how did spanish speaking people come to the united states should the united states try to control latino a immigration and is this even possible how has the silent minority been stereotyped by popular culture why don t traditional civil rights remedies work for latinos as is assimilation possible or even desirable for all latinos as what makes for conflict between latinos as and other racial groups are latinos as a race or an ethnicity should latino a children be taught in spanish what can border theory tell us about culture language and power

in march 2015 a group of experts from four continents and a wide range of disciplines met with the leading african american writer ishmael reed in mulhouse france and basel switzerland guided by swiss cultural and literary theorist sämi ludwig and deliberately migrating back and forth across a political border in the heart of europe they not only listened to reed and discussed his work but also looked more widely at the different meanings assigned to multiculturalism in the united states europe and other parts of the world this volume brings together their reflections

in the latinx files matthew david goodwin traces how latinx science fiction writers are reclaiming the space alien from its xenophobic legacy in the science fiction genre the book argues that the space alien is a vital latinx figure preserving latinx cultures by activating the myriad possible constructions of the space alien to represent race and migration in the popular imagination the works discussed in this book including those of h g wells gloria anzaldúa junot diaz andré m carrington



and many others often explicitly reject the derogatory correlation of the space alien and latinxs while at other times they contain space aliens that function as a source of either enlightenment or horror for latinx communities throughout this nuanced analysis the latinx files demonstrates how the character of the space alien has been significant to latinx communities and has great potential for future writers and artists

taking a critical research oriented perspective this book explores the theoretical empirical and pedagogical connections between reading and teaching young adult literature in middle and secondary classrooms and adolescent identity development
